Detailed Itinerary St Mawes single centre walking holiday

Minimum/maximum daily distances: 13 miles (21km)/10 miles (16km)

Average daily distance: 12 miles (19km) – (distances are dependent on your personal preferences)

Season: All year round

Cost of Holiday: **£100 per night** (assuming two people sharing a room - £110 per night in July and August)

Circular and linear walks from the beautiful sailing and fishing village of St Mawes. Daily walks are either circular or will start or finish with a ferry trip from/to St Mawes.

This independent walking tour is designed so that you do not require any transport of your own or from Nearwater during your stay. St Mawes is best reached via the mainline railway station in St Austell, which is 4.5 hours from London's Paddington station, and then a taxi ride to St Mawes. Parking is available if you come by car. Alternatively a train to Falmouth and a ferry trip to St Mawes.

Subject to the availability of accommodation, you can choose your own dates from between 2 nights (1 or 2 days' walking) and 7+ nights (the full 5 walking days with one or more rest days).

ABOUT THE WALK

Some trails follow part of the South West Coastal Path and others take you inland to vagrant lanes and footpaths of the Roseland peninsula. The Roseland peninsula with its mild climate and abundant wildlife is a magical place throughout the seasons.

St Mawes and the surrounding area is world famous for its sailing, Carrick Roads providing arguably the best coastal sailing in the country. Your views will regularly include sailing boats including the magnificent "Falmouth Working Boats" with their huge bowsprits and multicoloured topsails.

ACCOMMODATION AND SERVICES

Your accommodation will usually be at our very own luxury bed and breakfast in the beautiful fishing village of St Mawes for the duration of your self-guided walking tour.

The price of your holiday includes a full English breakfast each morning (or continental if you prefer) and detailed and informative guidance notes on each of your walks. We will also supply you with the relevant Ordnance Survey map, with the Nearwater trail highlighted, as well as all other information that you will need for your holiday.
